Since 1951, The Nature Conservancy has:


- Protected more than 125 million acres -- an area four times the size of New York State
- Attracted the support of 1 million members
- Established more than 1,400 preserves
- Expanded to work in 76 countries
- Pioneered new tools like debt-for-nature swaps and conservation easements
- Generated \$20 billion in public, private, and corporate funds for conservation over the last two decades

	At-risk lakes and wetlands with avoided impact	3 M ha
